In the Second Worship Service we were privileged to see and hear Sara Krueger's testimony for Christ. Sara came forward during the tent revival and prayed to accept Jesus as her Lord and Savior. Pastor Art returned to our in depth study of the book of Revelation with a sermon entitled "Power, Destruction and Resurrection," based on Revelation 11:6-14. Verse 6 talks about the power of witnessing. Witnessing, plainly put, is explaining to the world why we are happy because of God. The witnesses in Revelation are God's response to the question of why. It is for the glory of God! The sermon title "Power, Destruction and Resurrection" is a description of Jesus Christ.

What happens when we have power in our witness? Those called by God are empowered to bring the gospel. The gospel changes lives. Pastor Art acknowledged the witness of a godly couple during his teen years. That couple was Pat and Holly Gorsett. Pat taught Pastor Art how to play the banjo and invited him to join their musical group. Everything they did (Pat & Holly) was connected to their relationship with God. They were a powerful influence in Pastor Art's life.

The power this scripture passage refers to is from God. These witnesses are in the future. It is a prophecy that is now attainable based on the electronic age that we are living in. These witnesses were doing supernatural things. They

- Be well-versed in the Scriptures and memorize verses and passages that you can use to share the Gospel.
- Be approachable and friendly
- Show Compassion in times when others need you.
- Show Grace when others make mistakes
- Plant seeds about our bible study times and church worship services
- Offer to pray with folks when they are down
- Offer to pray over a meal when out to eat with others
- Share your personal testimony of how Christ came into your life
- Don't partake in crude or dirty jokes same with filthy language
- Keep your bible on your desk at work.

are a threat to the world. It is the power that God gives you to be firm in your stand and witness yet others are against you.

Verse 7 reminds us that at the end of their testimony (3 1/2 years), they will be killed. Their dead bodies will be left on the streets of Jerusalem (vs 8). Read Revelation 9:11. The Hebrew term **Abaddon** and its Greek equivalent Apollyon appear in the Bible as both a place of destruction and an angel of the abyss. It is also called the Angel of Destruction. This is who kills the witnesses. Read Revelation 17:8 and Revelation 20:1, 3. God allows the beast to kill the witnesses. It is a desecration to leave a body unattended. There is no honor or respect shown to these individuals. The rest of the world is partying. It is a picture of the Anti-Christmas. The world celebrates Christmas but Christ followers celebrate the birth of Christ.

By speaking the gospel truth, these two prophets tormented those nonbelievers. Vs 11 tells us that God breathed life into their bodies. A miracle occurred and he called them home. Everyone witnessed this and were afraid. Vs 13 predicts another earthquake and survivors give glory to God. Read Matthew 28:11-15. This documents that people (guards) were bribed to tell a lie. There is a difference between glorifying God and knowing who God is. Are you ready? Read Romans 8:28 and John 10:27.






OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD
