### **SERMON SUMMARY**

Revelation 11:15 – 19 – The Seventh Trumpet

Pastor Art returned to his sermon series from the book of Revelation and continued his sermon entitled "The Seventh Trumpet," based on Revelation 11:15-19. The book of Revelation gives you different views of what is happening on earth and in heaven. The blowing of the seventh trumpet heralds the return of Christ. Read Revelation 10:6-7 and I John 2:15-17. The kingdom of the present age is ruled by Satan. The world is full of sin. Earthly kingdoms are in rebellion against God. Watch out for the little gods. Read I

Corinthians 4:4.

The Kingdom of God is revealed in three parts. 1) The first is an outward expression of how we live. We are a reflection of the kingdom and our lifestyle reflects the light of Christ into the world. 2) The next part is an inward reflection of Christ. What is in your heart? Because it will be reflected in how you live your life. 3) God needs to rule in your life. God is sovereign. It is important to be giving glory to God in all circumstances. A Christ follower needs to walk in the light of Christ. Read Chronicles 7:14 and I Corinthians 15:23-28. In this passage in Revelation, we see the church worshipping God. Read Matthew 6:10, Revelation 4:4, and Psalm 2. Satan knows this day is coming soon. Satan is stirring things up in this world. Satan will unite the nations against

### NEW HOPE MISSION INTERNATIONAL UPDATE

<u>Modified Annual Report</u>: Over the past year, we have observed school protocol that we believe are good.

- Teachers and professors in each school motivate and encourage students to participate in Sunday worship.
- Teachers and professors are actively engaged and participate in school engineering.
- o Interschool activities at the community level are provided that allow the students to gauge their skills in a particular activity or subject.

In what ways did the School Board assist the mission schools in providing specific policies for implementation?

- Provided counsel {advice} on three levels: administrative, disciplinary, and academic
- Assisted the directors in achievement of the various objectives set for the school
- Helped mission schools organize training sessions for teachers in order to improve the quality of their work and, consequently, maximize the school's performance.

School Directors shared, "Teacher training workshops help each teacher to receive learning in order to develop better teaching methods. The conference programs focused on methodology and the psychology of teaching. Classes shared knowledge to prepare lessons, to enjoy the children, and the process of teaching. There were topics relating to the health of the children and methods on how to work efficiently with children who have the difficulty of learning. Much was taught, and all the teachers are happy to learn."
