1 Thessalonians 5:16-19 – Cultivating an Attitude of Gratitude

Pastor Art shared a message entitled "Cultivating An Attitude of Gratitude," based on I Thessalonians 5:16-19. Actually, he started out in II Timothy 3:1-5. He stated that we need to take accountability for thanking God. Regardless of world or personal circumstance, we are called to rejoice and celebrate our resurrected Christ. Always! Sometimes God will put you

Christ. Always! Sometimes God will put you through the fire to save others. Read Psalm 100:1-5 again. We need to recognize that God is responsible for our success. Read Philippians 4:4-8. Satan tries to hijack your thoughts. Meditate on what God is doing. Praise and worship should be exciting.

Praying without ceasing involves speaking to God on a regular basis. Pleasant speech. Cultivating a thankful heart. Celebrating in all circumstances includes learning through loss. Read Genesis 50:20. Joseph had some tough experiences. But he was thankful for God's provision, guidance and protection.

Three points of thanksgiving: First, even in the roughest times, God can produce a miracle for us to give thanks. Read John 6:8-11. Second, we need to give thanks even when it doesn't seem like we have enough. Read I Corinthians 11:23. Third, we are to be thankful even when we are depleted and listen for God's way. Psalm 100:1-5

Christ. There is always a reason to rejoice in God's grace. Read I Corinthians 10:23-33. Remember this: Satan tries to get you off balance. Satan does not have control over you. This scripture passage points out that when we give thanks, God can delete all sin. Learn to edify (lift up) others. Read Mark 8:33. Rebuke Satan and he will flee. We are not on our own when we give ourselves to Christ. We are a part of the body of Christ. We submit to the will of God.

NEW HOPE MISSION INTERNATIONAL UPDATE

Beginning of School MannaPack Update: Due to the government's delay in certifying the pass/fail grades of the 2023/2024 school year, the beginning of school had to be postponed until the second week of October. On the field, the excitement of almost 2,000 enrolled children awaiting opening day was marked by hearts full of anticipation. Feeding programs at each school are operational, but as many know, despite the Mission's continued attempts of intervention, our MannaPack container has been denied clearance from port officials. {To date, the container has been detained for 15 months.} Before NHMI Founder and U.S. Director, Brent Baird left for the field in November, he compiled all relevant paperwork. Just this week he met with one of Haiti's ten regional governors asking for his assistance in the release of these much needed mannapacks. The meeting produced a positive result, and the governor indicated he would help us. He expressed sincere thanks as Brent and team member Pastor Myron prayed for him.

The Federal Aviation Administration issued a notice last Tuesday that prohibited U.S. airlines and other civilian aircraft from operating below 10,000 feet in Haitian airspace for 30 days. The ban comes after gangs shot at planes from three U.S. airlines {Spirit, Jet Blue, and American} hitting a Spirit Airlines jet as it was landing in the capital of Port-au-Prince. One flight attendant was injured. Naturally, this affects NHMI. The Mission's airline of almost 35 years, Missionary Flights, Inc. has applied for a humanitarian aid exception. Please pray as a board member shares, "There has been a major increase in violence {in the south} and now quite a few areas of famine. In the north, food prices have escalated and there is a shortage of gas again."



MEN'S ENCOUNTER 2025

Men's Encounter is a 48 hour weekend, where men (18 years & older) from all walks of life, can experience the power and freedom, paid for by Jesus on the cross. There are 14 different sessions. Each session has a time of praise and worship, true life testimonies, teaching from God's Word and a time of personal reflection.
