SERMON SUMMARY

1 Corinthians 2:1-5 – The Hope We Have in Jesus

Filling in for Pastor Art, Elder JC Claypool shared a message entitled "The Hope We Have in Jesus," based on I Corinthians 2:1-5. He also talked about the passage from I Corinthians 3:9 where it points out the importance of laying the foundation because of Jesus Christ. The church of Corinth was one of Paul's mission churches and it figured prominently in his prayers. Despite Paul's many persecutions, he felt deeply about the mission churches that he had set up. The Church in Corinth struggled greatly because of worldly influence and pressure. In these scripture passages he talks about the importance of sacrificial love or agape love.

OCC is growing. Discipleship is a primary focus. Throughout the study of the book of Revelation, we are challenged to keep our focus on Jesus. Do we worship God on our way to church or just at church? Do we worship God after we leave the church on Sunday morning?


SLATE OF NOMINEES FOR CHURCH BOARD

COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING SERVICE

On Tuesday, November 26, OCC hosted the Orrick Community Thanksgiving Service with about 68 people in attendance. The service started with a welcome, scripture reading and prayer from Pastor Jacob Overstreet of the Orrick Baptist Church. Drew & Katie Gill led us in worship songs, communion song and closing song. Pastor Art gave a message about everyday being Thanksgiving. HIs primary scripture passage was Luke 17:11-19. He challenged us to be the one to give thanks even in the hard times. He talked about Paul writing the prison epistles (Ephesians 5:19; I Thessalonians 5:16) where even in the midst of brutality and darkness, he repeatedly expresses thanksgiving and challenges the churches to be the one to give thanks and grace. Paul clearly presents an attitude of gratitude. Three takeaways: 1) Be thankful in your mouth - speak in thanksgiving. Read Hebrews 13:15; Psalm 150 and Psalm 147:7. 2) Be conscious of what comes out of your mouth. Think before you speak. Does it edify or degrade? 3) Praise God in daily life and work. Do your best. Work as though for the Lord. You are different from others. Read Colossians 3:22-24 and Colossians 4:1-2. Thanksgiving is what God calls us to do. Pastor Bob Sanders of the Orrick Methodist Church closed the service with prayer.

OCC YOUTH SERVICE OPPORTUNITY AND FUNDRAISER

At Orrick Christian Church, we make fellowship a priority and we also seek ways to edify and uplift one another. NEW HOPE MISSION INTERNATIONAL UPDATE

Vacation Bible Schools - 115 Children Accept Jesus. Mission partners often ask what does Vacation Bible School look like in a third world country? It means sharing the Gospel while meeting practical needs within the community. Much like Haiti Hunger Relief, people are desperate for provision but their hearts fiercely trust in the Lord to meet their needs. Therefore, as each mission church celebrated VBS, the Gospel message was shared through Bible stories, skits, games, and lunchtime provision. Pastor Widenel shares, "The New Hope Church of Cima greatly thanks the Mission for financially supporting the VBS this year. The theme of this event: 'Jesus loves all children'. During these 8 days {of ministry}, we have children who accepted Christ. We give glory to God for these

children." As pastoral reports were received, our hearts rejoiced in the salvation of 115 children.




UPDATE FROM JARED & ANNA ODLE WITH DEVELOPING KIDS GHANA
