#### **SERMON SUMMARY**

John 1:1-4, 14 - God Revealed

12/2 - Isaiah 41:10 "Hope and Assurance." Read Psalm 23 and Romans 8:28.

12/3 - Romans 5:1-5 "Believing God's Promises." Read Isaiah 41:10 and Romans 15:13.

12/4 - None.

12/5 – Psalm 107:1, Romans 5:6-10 "Goodness of God" Read Psalm 34:8, Romans 10:9, Micah 7:13

12/6 – John 14:1-6 "Hope" Read John 3:16-17 Filling in for Pastor Art, Elder Phil Boude shared a message entitled "God Revealed. Brother Phil talked about how things we smell, taste or even the seasons of the year can bring back memories, both good and bad. The history of our lives are bookmarked by these memories. Bad memories can also be bookmarked. Memories mean something different to a believer versus a nonbeliever. We just had Thanksgiving which means something different to a believer versus a nonbeliever. Christmas should be a completely different thing for a believer versus a nonbeliever.

If you have a negative bookmark but are a believer you should be filled with joy, peace and salvation through God's grace. We should not focus on the negative but rejoice always. God lifts us through his Word.

If we struggle to rejoice maybe we don't have a complete understanding of who Christ is. We should remind ourselves of who Christ is and what He did for us to get us through times of struggle. Gospel of John has a dedicated purpose. John 1:1, 20:31. We have life by believing in Jesus. God has always revealed Himself to us. Why? To reveal Himself to us. Hebrews 1:1-3

John 1:1 – Beginning. Holy Spirit pulled the words in a way to be understood by the Jews and the Greeks. Before time. God exists outside of time, space and matter. The Word – Logos – several different applications but clearly as John wrote it Jesus was with

John 1:14 – The Word became flesh and we saw His glory. God became flesh. To reveal Himself to us, God came to us from His throne, became man, dwelt among us for 33 years, displaying all the deity and attributes of God. Jesus through his obedience brought redemption to men on the cross. Read Romans 5.

If we find ourselves instead of rejoicing always, feeling the presence of joy and hope, can we not take a moment to remind ourselves of the sacrifice that God made so that we would have life eternal? Remember that when we feel weak, God hangs on to us. It is His strength not ours. This must be the source of our joy. Read James.
